Grease in Sewage Lines

The Community is experiencing serious issues with grease clogging in sewage lines. As a reminder:

- **DO NOT** pour any cooking oils or grease into your **kitchen sink (even if you are ‘washing it down’ with hot water), bathroom sink, toilet or other drain lines.**
- Pour all used cooking oils and grease into a small container (such as an empty coffee can) so it can cool and harden.
- When the container is full, cap the container or cover it tightly, place in a bag to prevent leakage and place in garbage container.
- Some cooking oils can be recycled into biofuels. Some counties accept cooking oil at their recycling facility.
- Dry wipe all pots, pans and plates before washing in the sink or dishwasher. Use paper towels and wipe grease and food contents into a garbage container.
- If you have a kitchen sink garbage grinder, use this as little as possible since food particles and grease from the grinded material will still clog your pipes and affect the downstream sewer system.
