Who Qualifies?

Nonprofit organizations that promote comprehensive domestic violence programs and a coordinated and collaborative community response to domestic violence in Prince George's County are eligible to submit one or more applications for the Prince George's County Council

Prince George's County Council Domestic Violence Grant Program.

Applicants are required to apply for grant funding through the Prince George's County Council Grants Office and satisfy all grant requirements.
